Public Comment (On Agenda Items):

<u>Chris Barto 4607 Metcalf:</u>(Topic Ranger Power) Reread John Borkovich affecting wildlife from solar polar. It was also read and noted from public hearing comments. He has 27 Years with the DNR

Andrea Heering: 4490 Cole Rd Ft Gratiot (Topic Ranger Power) If they have come up with a solution to our wells with the water run-off. Do not see it in any minutes. She also discussed The new law giving the mspc control has been passed and signed by Whitmer but doesn't go into effect until the end of Nov 2024...the ballot initiative to restore local control will be on the ballot the 1st part of November and when its passed it will repeal the law giving the control back to the local governments...IF... for some reason the mspc retains control and the local government had previously denied the Solar companies application then a new application has to be submitted to the local government again and the local government has 4 months to make their determination before the applicant can go to the mspc for them to force it in an area...if the local government says yes to the applicant and before the law is repealed then they CAN'T revoke that yes once the law is repealed.

<u>Billie Nugent 4980 McIntyre Rd:</u> (Topic Ranger Power) Andrea hit it on the head. I was talking to Tobey at the convention center, in regard to our well water. Advise to have wells tested 6 months before they start and continue after every 6 months (Franz mentioned he would make a phone call to the county)

<u>Angela Defrain 5045 Parker Rd</u> – If they were here I would have more to say. I am against the project. I do have the petition for cities for local choice

Jill Barto 4607 Metcalf: - Still against this project. It will affect our real-estate values and moving

<u>Shane Richarson 3775 Pollina Ave:</u> – Thank you very much for all the time you guys have put into and the research.

Strongly oppose solar along Clyde township agricultural land. Does not offer health and wellness. Bold and fine state that addresses your ordinance. Will expand 30-

<u>Sandy Richardson 4126 Cole Rd</u>: Thank Mr. Beeler for taking the time to come to the township to listen to the residents. This is not for the community. We have put tons of money into our farms to raise our kids. Not fair that the state has just decided this is ok. This is a disgrace to see this taken out underneath us with no notice. Senior Citizens on her road have no idea how to sell their homes and move on. So thank you again for being here.

<u>Vance Richardson 4126 Cole Rd:</u> Attended numerous meetings, opposed to the solar that has been pushed upon us. Take over 1000 acres of privately owned land. Clyde plus Fort Gratiot. Solar projects result in the loss of agricultural land. This is the beginning; they will keep asking for more. Port Side Solar says that it does not. It will be tied up for 40 years. They said it will give part-time jobs but not think of all the farming jobs that will be eliminated. Who wants to buy land like that? Also aware that Chris Barto has circulated petitions with 400 signatures in our township. Please do diligence to help turn this thing down.

<u>Tom Nutt 4481 North Rd:</u> Concerned about the roundabout with all the plastic in the ditches. It has been over a year, when are they going to take it out?

<u>Austin Richardson 4126 Cole Rd</u>: Stress that I do not support the solar project. It is not 1.2 acre or 1 it is 100s. Not harmonious for the landowners. Please, do your due diligence in representing your residences.

State Representative Andrew Beeler started by saying "thank you to the Planning Commission members for a thankless job." He grew up in Grant Twp on 20 acres that his father still owns in a non-industrial location. He went on to talk about the Solar Bill that the Governor had on the table, that he was opposed to. The States main focus is Green Energy, and the Planning Commission is in an uncomfortable position. If locally it is decided to not allow Solar, it will then go to the MPSC after the first of the year. There are so many unanswered questions as to how this will all play out. And Mr. Beeler offered himself to be a resource to the township and the residents.
